Program Description

Students majoring in Nonprofit Management will focus on building skills in organizational governance, finance, administration, and entrepreneurial drive. Students will learn to find creative ways to generate operating finances and to attract high caliber professionals and volunteers, to work effectively with board members, to develop a marketing plan, write a grant proposal, and develop a program budget. Many of the Nonprofit Management faculty have worked as nonprofit managers and will share what they have learned.

Program Highlights

Accelerated format	Major course work can be completed in 20 months
Class format	Face-to-face instruction in Grayslake; meeting once a week in 4 hour sessions; seven weeks each in duration
BA/BGS options	BA general education requirements designed by North Park; BGS general education requirements designed by IAI.
Prior learning assessment	Students have the possibility of earning up to 20 credits through Prior Learning Assessment; workshops at the end of the major (during Level Three of the Learner Assessment) will assist student to determine credit possible; this can include corporate/ occupational training and learning gained from work experience.
Financial aid	Student loans, Federal Pell Grants, and Illinois MAP Grant benefits

Admission Requirements

- 12 hours of transferable college-level coursework with a 2.00/4.00 cumulative GPA.
- North Park will accept up to 90 semester hours from two-year institutions and up to 90 hours if some work is from four-year institutions. Completion of general education requirements in Illinois Articulation Initiative (IAI).
- The Associate in Arts and Associate in Science degrees from the College of Lake County will fulfill the Bachelor of General Studies requirements required for general education at North Park University.
- All other two-year associate degrees or certificate programs will be evaluated on a course by course basis. (Applied Arts or Applied Sciences will not fully satisfy Illinois Articulation Initiative).

Application Procedure

- Submit completed application; no application fee.
- Submit official transcripts from all previous college work.

Graduation Requirements

- Thirty-six (36) semester hours of major coursework.
- Forty-five (45) semester hours of core requirements, including NPU's Introduction to the Bible course and a second course in religion.
- A minimum of one hundred and twenty (120) semester hours, thirty-four (34) semester hours earned at NPU.
- A "C" average (2.0 GPA on a 4.0 scale) for all work taken at NPU.
- A "C" average within the thirty-six (36) semester hour major.

The following are the North Park University requirements/ courses and their CLC equivalents. The Associate in Arts or the Associate in Science from the College of Lake County will fulfill the University Core Curriculum requirements required for general graduation purposes at North Park University.

This transfer guide is designed to assist students with their academic planning. Every effort is made to maintain accurate information; however, this information is subject to frequent change.
