The major in Nonprofit Management is designed for adults with work experience who are seeking to enter the nonprofit sector or to move into leadership positions in nonprofit organizations. This major will provide you with the knowledge and "on the job" skills to enable you to make the world a better place by working on issues that you're passionate about.

TARGET AUDIENCE:

Working adults who want to complete their bachelor's degree in a values-based educational environment.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS:

- at least 12 sh from an accredited college or university;
- at least 2.0 gpa (on a 4.0 scale);
- free online application;
- official transcripts from all colleges attended.

Prospective students may fax applications and unofficial transcripts for the initial evaluation.

COST:

\$490 per semester hour. Ask about scholarships.

APPLICATION PROCEDURE:

Application procedure: Submit a free application and official transcripts from all colleges attended.

Prospective students may fax applications and unofficial transcripts for the initial evaluation. Upon evaluation and acceptance, students are referred to a School of Adult Learning advisor to discuss program options and orientation.

REGISTRATION PROCEDURE:

Students may register on-line at the North Park website.

ACADEMIC CALENDAR:

Year-round calendar with six intensive sessions. Each session is seven weeks in duration.

DELIVERY MODE:

Bachelor's degree in Nonprofit Management available face-to-face, online, or hybrid.

LOCATION(S) OF COURSES:

University Center facility in Grayslake

TEXTBOOK PURCHASE:

Texts are available online through the North Park bookstore website.

TRANSFER HOURS POLICY:

Students may transfer a maximum of 90 semester hours of credit from a community college or up to 90 semester hours of credit from an accredited four-year college or university. Courses will be evaluated on a course-by-course basis.

TOTAL HOURS NEEDED:

Minimum of 120 credit hours, including all major and general education requirements.

SPECIAL CHARACTERISTICS:

- Accelerated and intensive class sessions meet once a week for seven weeks
- Two degree options (B.A. and B.G.S.) provide flexibility for transfer students
- Prior Learning Assessment (PLA) is a systematic process by which School of Adult Learning students may earn academic credit for prior learning gained outside of a traditional classroom setting. College-level learning is awarded when the student is able to demonstrate learning, whether from informal life experience, professional training, certification, licensure, or any other source.
