ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS:

Interested students should contact Amanda Winters for support through admission and registration processes. Students must have:

- A minimum of 30 credit hours
- GPA of 3.2 or higher on a 4.0 scale from an accredited college or university
- 6 semester hours of English composition
- The following courses prior to transfer:
HIS 201 World History or HIS 202 European History (3 sh)
HIS 203 U.S. History (3 sh)
- Access to the Internet and possess required computer skills to study online
- Completed online application (<http://www.uis.edu/admissions>) and \$50 application fee
- A statement of intent described on the website

Early application is advised as only a limited number of students are admitted each semester.
